3. Chair's Report - Johnna

- a. Suggestion to include an invitation to join the PAC in the next Grade 8 welcome package
- b. At the end of meeting last month, PAC received a letter (through Sonia) indicating that PAC had received \$2,500 donation from Legion
 - Sonia: Paula received the cheque and it should have been deposited into PAC account

4. Treasurer's Report - Biljana

a. Gaming Account Balance: \$23,655.73

b. Regular Account Balance: \$1,102.70

- c. Submitted 2024 spending report to government for gaming, itemized
- d. PAC accounts need to have BCeID accounts
- e. Next year (2025-2026) funding application process will open April 1, 2025
 - Funding is \$25 per student enrolled
- f. \$800 was paid for school store Point of Sale software, but it was never used
- g. During next PAC meeting in March, we will vote for Gaming asks from teachers

5. Prom Committee Report - Marion, Sonia

- a. Initial meeting completed, 5 parents attended
- b. Considered Heritage Hall, Pan Pacific, Stanley Park Pavilion
 - Decided on Stanley Park Pavilion (half the price of Heritage Hall at ~\$11,000 for 90 people, all-inclusive of facility, food, etc.)
 - Need help from parents with decorations, transportation (bus) for those who need a ride
- c. Event is planned for Thursday June 13
 - Access at 3pm, event to start at 6pm, expected close at 10pm
- d. Charging \$60 per student, funds to cover those who cannot afford it
- e. Prom committee (not PAC) will need to make any additional decisions/requests
- f. Eva: Suggest Prom Committee to ask parent / community for donated prizes that are raffled off at the party
- g. Sonia will be hiring security separately

Motions & Actions:

Sonia to pay \$1,000 deposit and sign contract with venue

Sonia to engage Katie (sponsor teacher for grad) once contract signed to coordinate outstanding tasks

6. Teacher Funding Requests

- a. Johnna: Desire to streamline / standardize application process to make it easier to evaluate (e.g. standard information, max word count). Want teachers to express what else is being done to raise the funds (e.g. by students who benefit)
- b. Current request template (email sent by Hannah): Brief explanation, total amount requested, \$ request to PAC, other funding sources, # students impacted, grades impacted, if asking for PAC to fund 100% of cost then teacher needs to explain why
- c. Marion: What about Google Forms?

- a. Semester Turnaround 2026 Plan Teena

- b. Eva: Used computers donated by Britannia community to be offered to students who need them at home
 - Johnna / Anita: We need to hire professionals (funded by PAC) to sanitize any technology that is donated by the community to students to minimize risk to students / PAC
